PASTOR'S CORNER

On her way to the guillotine, Marie Antoinette, a French aristocrat, stepped on her executioner's foot. Thus, her last words, the last thing she said before she died, was simply: "Pardonnez-moi, monsieur."

As he was dying, Alfred Hitchcock said, "One never knows the ending. One has to die to know exactly what happens after death, although Catholics have their hopes."

Basketball great "Pistol" Pete Maravich collapsed during a pickup game. His last words: "I feel great."

Then, of course, there is Groucho Marx. As Groucho was dying, he let out one last quip: "This is no way to live!"

I found these famous last words on a website called "Mental Floss." Honestly, I was hoping for something a little more, inspiring? The website listed 65 so-called famous last words. Here is just one more to help make my point:

In her 2014 memoir, Ginger Alden revealed Elvis Presley's final words before his death in 1977. During a night of sleeplessness, Presley told Alden, "I'm going to the bathroom to read."

It's kind of the icing on the cake, isn't it?

Over the course of six hours on Good Friday, Jesus died on the cross. Leaving us with not just a few "famous last words" but seven of them. Seven phrases



Jesus spoke during his six-hour torment on the tree—words with meaning and purpose. Many of the words are quoted directly from scripture. Words that help us better understand the depth of his sacrifice, the height of Jesus' love for you and me:

Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do.

Today you shall be with me in paradise. Woman, behold, thy son! Behold, thy mother! My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? I thirst.

It is finished.

Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit.

These Words, Jesus' Words, truly are Words that Last Forever. And words that are worthy of us knowing, thinking about and remembering. Words that help us know Jesus just a little better. And, of course, Jesus' love for you and me.

We bonded mightily and will remain friends forever; I know the cast will be praying for all of the students on the mission trip, and probably for the rest of their lives. I already miss sitting around the table with our scripts and stories, but I know this story isn't over. Thank you to everyone that helped with and supported this adventure!



Rushford Lutheran Church's high school seniors planning to attend a technical school or college in the fall of 2025 can apply for the Rushford Lutheran Church Servanthood Scholarship. For an application, please email the church office at rlc@acegroup.cc.

The application must be returned to the church office on or before Monday, April 7, 2025. Get your application today by emailing rlc@acegroup.cc

No late applications will be considered. The amount of the scholarship is determined by a point system. The criteria is based on:

- 1. Interview (punctuality/appearance);
- 2. Question responses;
- 3. Church involvement;
- 4. Community involvement; and
- 5. Application appearance.



Maximum scholarship will be \$500 with minimum of \$100. Please take this into consideration when you return your application.
